The Dramatists Legal Defense Fund will present their toolkit: DRAMATIC CHANGES: A Guide to Producing Stage Works on College Campuses in Turbulent Times. How do stakeholders on college campuses resolve the tensions which have arisen between the value of free expression on the one hand, and the intense and overdue imperative to advance values of diversity, equity, and inclusion on the other?
