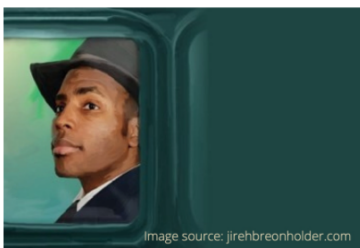

Today's Accomplishments:

Tonight, we started with Sally and Evelyn working through Act II, scene 11. After our initial run through, we focused our attention on clearing specifics and the reasons why we must use these words now in two sections: how Sally and Evelyn met, and the bottom of page 71 when Sally using the bible verse. Clearing these moments up made a major difference in the life of the scene. Everything “clicked” into place and the scene took a strong step forward. Well done. We still need to discover how the exit will work, but otherwise, the scene is in good shape.

We then turned our attention to the final scene between Tony and Sally: Act II, scene 13. We again ran the scene for continuity. We then clarified blocking for the opening of the scene. We worked on pace, objectives, and the need to “hear” - really “hear” lines like – “Bowzie’s lucky to have you.” What does that mean specifically to Tony? She didn’t say, “I’m lucky to have you.” She said, “Bowzie’s lucky to have you.” This then causes Tony to beg even stronger.

We clarified the blocking at the end of this scene. On page 83, after Sally says, “Thank you.” she will start to exit SL to change. Tony will stop her by saying, “Where you going, Sally?” Sally stops her exit – turns back to him. After she says, “That’s what respect looks like,” Sally exits SL. Tony, then exits SL to plead with her to stay. They are off stage when we begin the voice over – Act II, scene 14. Then during the voice over, we will see Sally, dressed, exit out of the house and DR. Tony will then slowly enter into the kitchen and sit in his chair, etc. This happens all while the voice over (we turned Act II, scene 14 into a voice over) plays. Kevin will solidify when these entrances/exits happen and the placement of the cast at the end. But we will return to our initial image of Bowzie, barefoot in his suit (dead) that we established in Act I, scene 1. The cast will then breathe together to end the show.

Actors:

- Memorize! Our off-book date is March 29th.
- As we have learned, the key to living your role is playing strong objectives (really affecting change in the other character) tied to specific subtext, tied to specific imagery – all tied to the given circumstances provided by the playwright. Work hard to always affect change. We’ve seen and felt the great results of this. Let’s keep moving forward in this direction.
